

## Travelling to King’s Fertility Assisted Conception Unit

Following egg collection, it is necessary to transport the eggs to King’s Fertility. Following the coronavirus pandemic, we strongly advise that you travel to Kings by car. Please note that the battery life of the incubators is **at least four hours** and they weigh approximately 6kg. You will need to provide your sample and wait at King’s while the incubator is emptied and checked. If King’s is busy you may need to wait there for up to an hour while the contents of the box are examined. Please note that King’s see patients in order of arrival. Once you have left you must come back to Kingston to pick up your partner and return the incubator.

### **By Car**

The journey should take between 45 minutes and one hour depending on traffic. Parking is extremely limited on the KCH site and there are relatively few other car parks available. Check availability at [www.en.parkopedia.com](http://www.en.parkopedia.com).

You may wish to visit the area to check parking availability in the surrounding streets prior to egg collection to avoid any additional stress on the day.

An alternative method would be to use a cab.

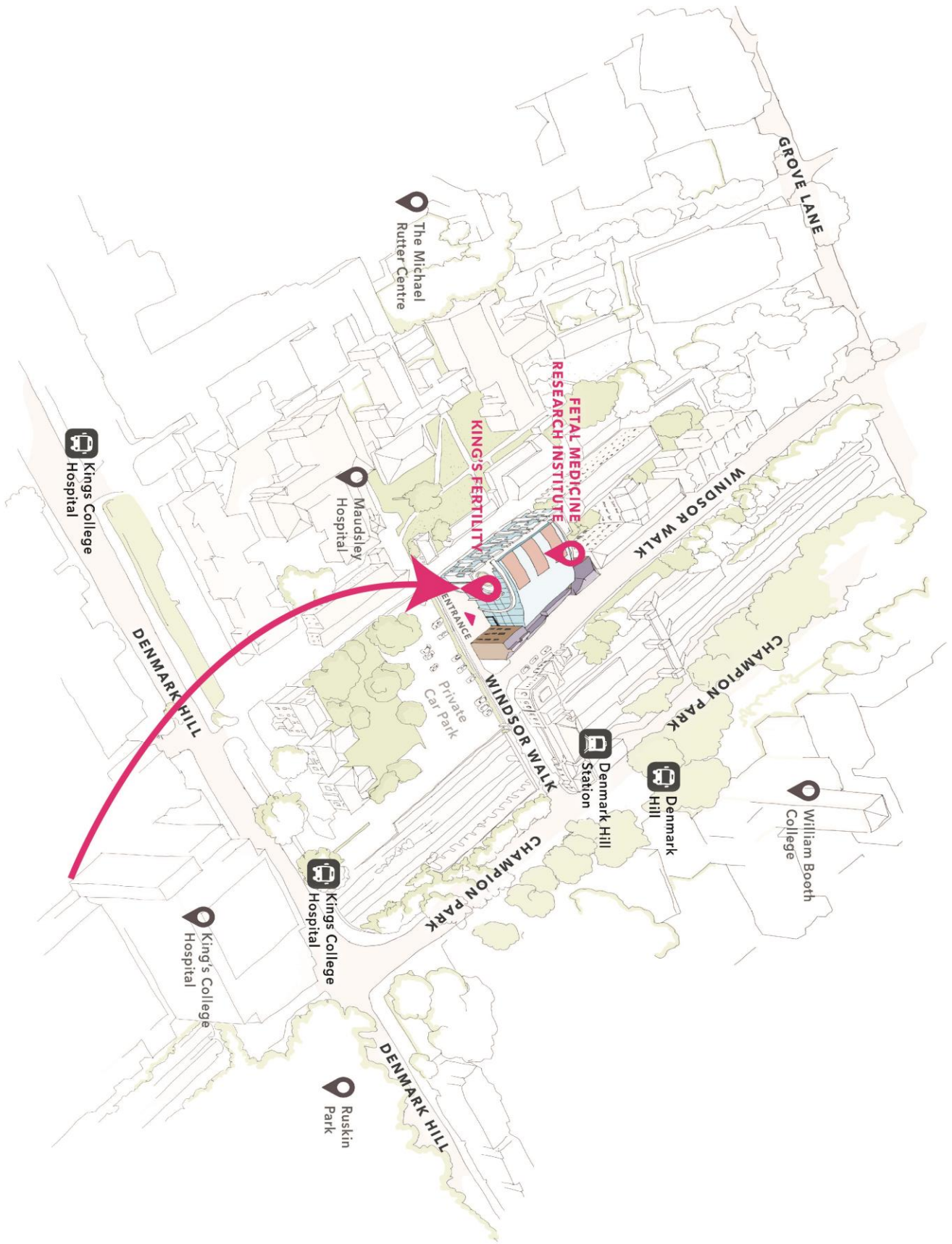
You should enter the Fetal Medicine Institute through the main entrance and report to the main reception desk where you will be expected.
